- **Home-based services** for children and youth was officially launched in April 2016. This service provides those age 5 and over, and their families, with support services to enhance daily living skills that will lead to independence.
- **New location purchased** in Phillipsburg in June 2016. Recognizing the need for additional programming space as well as the growing need of the community for our food pantry and thrift shop services, we are pleased to report that in 2017 we will open our doors at 1224 South Main Street, Phillipsburg. Stay tuned for updates and our grand opening!
- 3 Year CARF accreditation awarded in November 2016. This survey of our employment services resulted in ZERO recommendations for compliance. Congratulations to our employment team for maintaining and exceeding expectations in service provision!
- 8 new community funding partners joined us to support our mission of improving the employability and quality of life for people with different abilities. We could not do what we do without our funding partners as well as our donors, family members, volunteers and advocates.

New Services Launched ...

Individual Support Services

Funded by the Department of Children & Families (DCF) and referred by the Children's System of Care (CSOC), youth ages 5-20 are referred to Abilities for home based services. Staff teach such essential skills as bathing and showering, dressing, eating and teeth brushing. Our staff helps identify children's strengths and needs and implements strategies to effectively increase independence.





STAR SERVICES

Abilities and Warren County Community College have teamed up to provide new opportunities to the individuals that we serve. Star services provide individuals with the opportunity to develop their job readiness with classroom soft skill training, internships and community based career exploration opportunities, job coaching and supported employment supports and support in pursuing post-secondary education at WCCC or a college of their choice.


Technology and supports...





With the evolution of technology, and the support of several foundations, Abilities offers the use of computers, tablets and smart board technologies for educational, therapeutic and communication activities.





Keeping up with the printing needs of the community requires services to be upgraded as the needs arise. Abilities purchased a Direct to Garment printer for expanded training services. Digital print services are now offered at our storefront print shop, along with custom screen printing, embroidery, vinyl banner, sign printing and promotional products. Our print shop provides the opportunity to learn customer service skills along with valuable employment skills.




Who We Serve



Abilities operates six programs locations and provides a full array of services including medical special needs and behavioral support, adult habilitation, extended employment, employee development, vocational evaluation, supported employment, autism customized supports and student transition services.


