Message from the Chief Executive Officer

I am pleased to present the 2018-19 Annual Report for Abilities of Northwest Jersey, Inc. As you will see, this has been yet another year of amazing accomplishments and community support.

Founded in 1974, the core of our mission is to provide training and employment services for those with different abilities. This past year our Employment Pathways Division successfully increased community employment placements by 64%! This was the result of hard work by our team and service recipients, and the support of our business community. In the fall of 2019, we were proud to receive a 3-year accreditation determination for our employment and transition services from CARF International. Because of the impressive increase in placements, we received an *exemplary* determination by CARF for employment advocacy



and outcomes. Also, as a result of meeting every standard of service, we received an Adults with Autism Spectrum Disorder "population designation" for all accredited services, reflecting our commitment to the growing need of those with ASD.

It doesn't stop there. We provide exceptional services for those receiving day program and community support services as well. And in 2019, all Abilities day programs received 3-year certifications from the NJ Division of Developmental Disabilities. This was accomplished as we were winding up the complex system transition to Medicaid fee for service!

I continue to be so proud of this amazing Abilities team, and in awe of the impact we have had on so many lives in need. It would be impossible to provide these exceptional services without the support of our community. Thank you for taking the time to read through our report, and thank you for your part in ensuring each individual we serve is provided with the opportunity to live their best life.

Student Successes

Grant funding provided by the NJ Division of Vocational Rehabilitation allowed Employment Pathways to provide a paid internship opportunity to students in Warren County through a Pre-Employment Transition Services Program.

Students were supported in exploration and identification of career interests, then interned with an employer for six weeks while being paid minimum wage. Of the 23 students engaged in the grant:

- 7 were offered competitive employment upon the completion of the internship
- 7 gained enough confidence in themselves, they found employment before the end of the grant period
- 4 completed applications for various jobs in their community as the internship opportunity was winding down



Family Enrichment



Our Family Enrichment Committee has been busy providing both fun and educational activities for individuals and their families. Hosting three dance nights and a sing-along during the holidays, individuals were invited to join together for an evening of entertainment and camaraderie.

Additionally, the committee presented an opportunity for families to meet the newly appointed NJ Ombudsman, Paul Aronsohn. Another educational session included Elisa Cohen from NJWINS who presented information about SSI and SSDI in conjuction with employment.


