Expanding Resources

In March of 2020, we opened the doors to our new social enterprise, the WCC Campus Store. A collaboration with Warren Community College, the store is located inside the WCC campus, offering spiritwear made by PrintAbilities and every day accessories for purchase by faculty, staff, students and alumni.

The WCC Campus Store was operated by individuals enrolled in our Star on Campus program. Star on Campus combines classroom and community based instruction, with the goal of participants securing community based employment. The WCC Campus Store provides Star participants with valuable retail sales experience, customer service experience and general employment skill training.

While the pandemic forced WCC to close campus, our WCC Campus Store went virtual, offering spiritwear ordering online.

Hybrid Adaptations

March 16, 2020 is a day we will never forget. For the first time in our 46 year history, we closed our program and social enterprise doors, in response to the pandemic and state mandates.

After a few short weeks of training and preparing, we launched our services virtually while waiting to reopen. Staying connected and engaged with the individuals we support was imperative.

Sean has been enjoying the remote services very much and we are very happy that Abilities has implemented this program. He had been getting very bored being in the house all day, and it has been very beneficial to him to stay engaged with the staff and participate in the activities. Please keep up the good work... It helps to normalize the situation somewhat for him, and he loves it!

When day programs finally reopened, in late September with limited capacity, a hybrid version virtual and in-program services was implemented. Use of the program smartboards allowed individuals to see, hear and engage no matter how they were accessing services.

Just a couple of months later we had to close our day programs again, returning fully to virtual services. While we eagerly await when we can reopen our day programs yet again, those connected virtually are enjoying a myriad of programming including:




