Message from the Chief Executive Officer

2018 has been a year of "Expanding PossAbilities" in more ways than one! This year our inaugural music education program exploded as the very first Abilities song was written, the program curriculum developed and instruments, including pianos, were donated by our generous families and community partners. From this new program, the Abilities Choir was formed, with countless hours of training to provide the community with beautiful music. It is so moving to watch the talents of those we serve emerge during music classes and choir performances.

One of our greatest initiatives came to fruition in 2018 with the opening of our newly renovated and expanded site in Pohatcong, NJ. This 21,000 square foot building houses our PossAbilities Thrift Boutique and Branching Out Food Pantry on the upper level, offering training opportunities to those we serve, as well as resources for our community. The lower level expands individualized services, including state of the art sensory rooms to support the growing needs of those with autism and intensive behavioral challenges. At our grand opening in September, we kicked off our PossAbilities Campaign, a five-year fundraising campaign with a goal of raising \$1.75M to not only defray the costs of this project, but more importantly, to support our expansion of employment and individualized services for those in need.

As you read through this annual report, I hope you are inspired to join our PossAbilities Campaign with a contribution at any level, as every dollar has a positive impact on the individuals we serve. Together, let's continue to *Expand PossAbilities* for many years to come!

Employment Pathways Outcomes and Success

- Celebrated 25 new community employment placements

- Average hourly starting wage was \$8.89 {ranging from \$8.44 to \$12.75 an hour}

- Provided 82 paid job sampling opportunities
- Supported 23 students with community based student transition services
