come to work every day Christine said: **“ I enjoy working with people and making a difference. Helping someone reach their goals, even if they are small steps, is very fulfilling. ”**



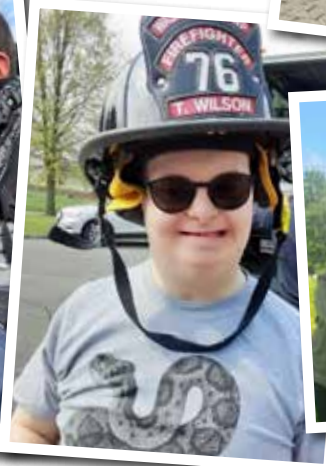
Connecting to the Community

Health and Wellness



Healthy living has been intergated into our day program scheduling at Abilities for many years. In 2023 we recieved grant funding from Atlantic Health- Hackettstown Medical Center Community Advisory Board (CAB) to expand our day program Cooking Clubs! Cooking Club activites include identifying healthy food choices, social interaction with peers, food preparation and cooking safely.

Community College Center for Adult Transition



In June 2023, we proudly celebrated the graduation of our inaugural Center for Adult Transition (CAT) class. CAT students attend class on the campus of Warren Community College for a one-year curriculum focused on: fundamentals for success, employment and career readiness, and specialized career exploration.

Community College Center for Adult Transition (CAT) will promote opportunities for independence in employment, post-secondary education, workplace readiness, living skills, and community engagement. Students will leave the CAT program with confidence, a self-advocate, and ready for independence in employment and life.

Rah'nisha discovered a passion for the health care field while attending the CAT program. With the support of her job coach, she now works at a local nursing home as an activities assistant.

Warren Campus Store operation provides our CAT program retail skill training opportunities and provides spirit wear and essential supply shopping to the students and staff of Warren Community College.

Project Search

September marked the expansion of Project SEARCH, an internship program for students with disabilities, to Atlantic Health System's Hackettstown Medical Center. This expansion created more opportunities for local high school seniors and recent graduates with disabilities. Abilities was excited to be selected as the employment supports organization. Working with Atlantic Health System's Newton Medical Center in previous years, we've successfully aided more than 16 interns in achieving employment.



Project SEARCH is a one-year, business-led, unpaid internship program for students in their last year of high school and young adults with disabilities, that takes place entirely at Atlantic Health System's Newton Medical Center or Hackettstown Medical Center in collaboration with Sussex County Educational Services Commission.

Joe got his start at Project SEARCH at the Atlantic Health System's Newton Medical Center. After graduating, Joe took the next step towards embarking on a career in the health care industry by enrolling for classes at The College of New Jersey. During school breaks he works for Morristown Medical Center, a major trauma center hospital and the flagship of the Atlantic Health System of hospitals.

“The staff in Newton was a critical part of my success, and I am grateful for their patience, friendship, and guidance. They prepared me for the position I have now as a support services associate, where my job is to deliver all required and ordered supplies to each hospital department, including the operating room.”

Pre-Employment Transition Services Paid Internship

Abilities is an approved provider of Pre-ETS services in Warren, Morris, Sussex, Hunterdon and Somerset counties. We met with great success in providing both individual and group Pre-ETS to 8 various school districts, and supported students with internship opportunities. Serving 53 students with outcomes of continued Pre-ETS planning and referrals for supported employment services, 83% of those students reported a positive internship experience. 7 individuals secured employment at the completion of the internship.

PossAbilities Thrift Boutique Flemington celebrated a grand opening of a new location at the Hunterdon Shopping Center on Reaville Avenue. The new space quadrupled capacity to allow for more merchandise, secondhand styles, home goods and furniture.

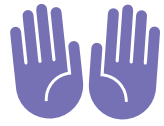

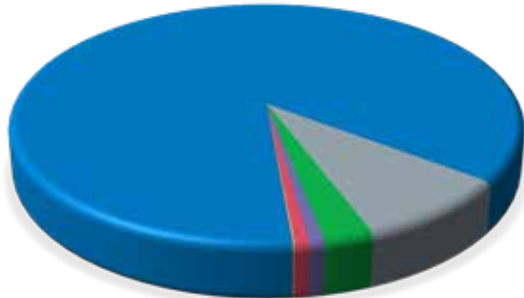

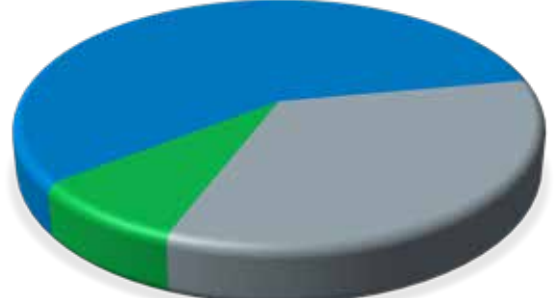

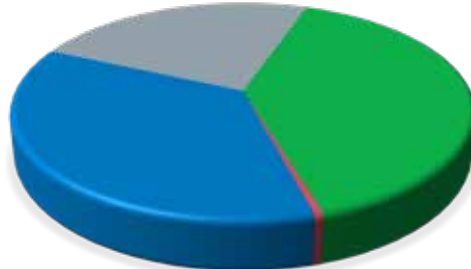
